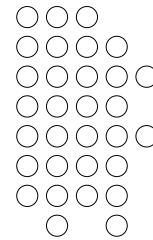

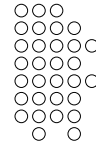

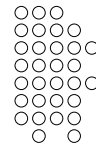
What Is ISBN Expansion?



- ISBN changes from 10 digits to 13
- ISBN-13 = EAN
- Also 12-digit UPC (used in retail) is changing to 13

Why Is It Happening?



- Doubles the pool of available ISBNs
 - Will run out of ISBN-10s by 2007
 - Electronic publishing & alternate formats increase need for more numbers
- Brings ISBNs and UPCs into conformity with international product numbering standards

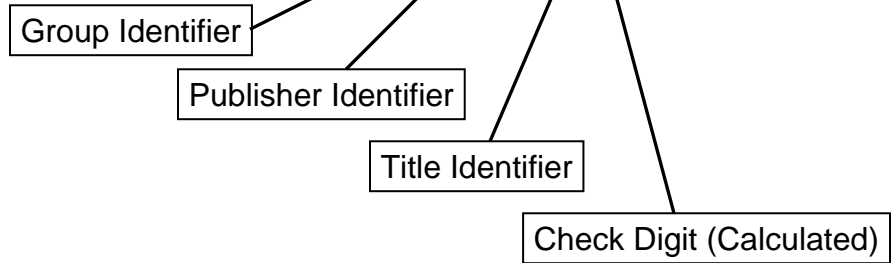

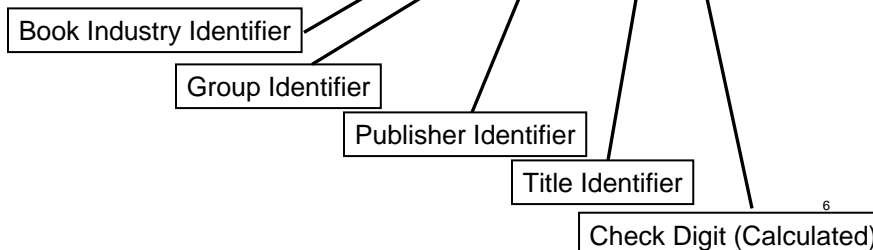

New ISBN Structure



1. Increase to 13 Digits – Add “978” and “979” Prefixes
2. Recalculate Check Digit Over First 12 Digits (no more Xs)

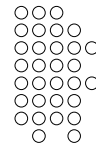

Important Dates



● ***October 1, 2004***

- LC started recording ISBN-13s in CIP and cataloging records
- OCLC started accepting input of 13-digit ISBNs, BUT is parking them temporarily in a non-ISBN field (024)

● ***January 1, 2007***

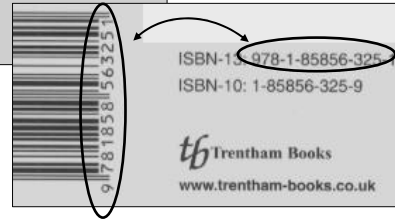
- Only ISBN-13 issued
- Stop using 10-digit ISBN for transactions
- 979-prefix ISBNs assigned as needed

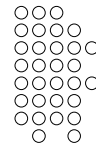

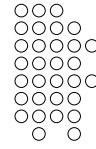

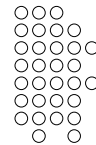

ISBN

The ISBN (International Standard Book Number) is a unique 10-digit number that identifies one title or edition of a title from one specific publisher and is unique to that edition. As the official ISBN Agency for the United States, Bowker is responsible for the assignment of the ISBN Publisher Prefix to those publishers with a residence or office in the U.S.

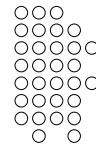

3-Digit ISBN

Bowker is heavily involved in the transition to the 13-digit ISBN for U.S. publishers, distributors, wholesalers and retailers. The main purpose of the ISBN revision project is to increase the numbering capacity of the ISBN system. As a result of electronic publishing and other changes in the publishing industry, the numbering capacity of the ISBN system is being consumed at a much faster rate than was originally anticipated when the ISBN system was developed for printed books in the late 1960's.

OCLC Interim Support for ISBN 13

A new international standard is expanding the current 10-digit ISBN to a 13-digit ISBN.

The new ISBN will consist of 13 digits: the 3-digit prefix that identifies the book industry (currently 978), followed by the core 9-digit number and the recalculated check digit that validates the internal integrity of the whole number. As such, it will also be identical to the EAN "bookland" 13-digit code that already appears encoded in the bar code printed on the back of the book. While the official date for moving to this new standard is January 1, 2007, some publishers expect to begin printing both the current 10- and the new 13-digit ISBNs in materials later this year. This will allow them to transition more easily to the new ISBN-13.

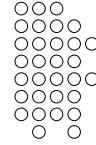
The Library of Congress expects to begin recording ISBN-13 numbers in LC records on October 1, 2004.

Because OCLC is in the process of moving to a new system/database platform, and because this implementation will not be complete by October, OCLC will adopt the following interim support for ISBN-13 numbers in WorldCat. This will allow OCLC to focus on completing the migration to the new platform without having to retrofit systems that will soon be retired.

- Records loaded into WorldCat from the Library of Congress and our other trading partners:
 - OCLC will convert a 13-digit number appearing in field 020 subfield \$a to an EAN (field 024, first indicator '3').
 - If the record contains a 13-digit ISBN without a corresponding 10-digit ISBN, OCLC will convert a 13-digit ISBN beginning with 978 to a 10-digit ISBN, modifying the check digit along the way, as well as convert to an EAN as indicated above.

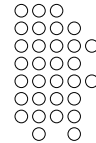

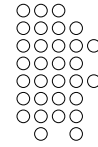

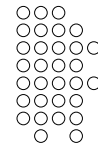
What's Happening at YBP?

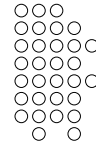
How Innovative uses ISBNs



- Searching in the WebOPAC
- Duplicate checking when keying records
- Duplicate checking from Headings Reports
- Ordering – *especially electronic ordering*
- Inn-Reach Overlay matching

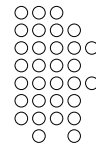
How Innovative uses ISBNs



- *Innovative Release notes*
- *2005LE and earlier:* load, store, index, and check for duplicate 13 digit ISBNs and accommodate 13 digit ISBNs with ISBN
- *2005:* EDIFACT ordering accepts 13 digit ISBNs
- *2006:* 13 digit ISBN validation, overlay and INN-Reach matching algorithms.

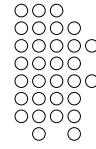
What will the changes mean?



- ***BISAC electronic ordering WILL NOT WORK! (Based on 10 digit blocks)***
- Libraries using electronic ordering need to change to EDIFACT well before January 2007.
- Many libraries are changing now.

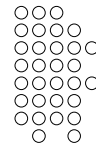
What will the changes mean?



- EDIFACT vs. BISAC
 - FTP vs. email
 - Modest changes in vendor record
 - Basic functionality remains the same (send POs from the send screen).
 - Potential for more than just one direction of information.
 - Better support for longer field sizes and the use of blanket PO#s

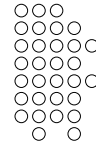

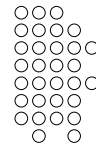

What might not work after the “change”?

- While the ISBN index will be fine, it may not find potential duplicates because:
 - Existing record only has an ISBN-10
 - New record only has an ISBN-13
- Database records may not find matches if ISBNs are just converted to the 13 digit number.
- NOTE: Some Indexing changes might make these not be a problem with Release 2006 – more details to follow.

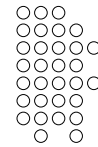
What is Innovative doing?



- Creating an indexing scheme to search and retrieve both traditional ISBNs as 13 digit ISBNs and expanded ISBNs (with the 978 prefix) as traditional ISBNs regardless of how they are entered in the bib record.
- Expanding functionality in EDIFACT ordering to better accommodate the ISBN-13
- Full support of ISBN-13 will come with Release 2006

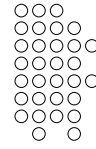
What should I be doing?



- Check Load Tables to make sure you are loading the 024.
- Find and convert 024 fields to 020 as per CSDirect to ensure that they can be found by the patrons.
- Change BISAC to EDIFACT Electronic Ordering*
- Talk to Your Vendors
 - Book Vendors
 - Content Providers
 - Innovative

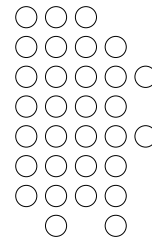
